t Trinity United Church we are pleased to provide you with safe, warm and reliable childcare each Sunday morning. Our paid caregiver, Alyssa, has been carefully screened and trained to ensure that you and your child will have the best experience possible. We work hard to provide a comfortable, caring and stimulating environment for your children.

There are a couple of new surprises in the nursery this year! Pop in and see the beautiful new mural created by our own talented Nancy Dewar-Stenning.

Please note the following guidelines:

Upon arrival please remove your shoes/boots outside the room (this will ensure that the floors stay clean for your children). Please bring a clean pair of slippers or shoes for your child to wear while in the nursery.

Sign-in book: Please write down your name, the child's name, age, and any special concerns

(food allergies, special needs, etc.).

If available, please provide us with your cell phone number and put your phone on vibrate so that we can contact you if necessary while you are attending worship.

Food: Please note that we ask parents/caregivers to avoid sending food with your child while in the nursery. We wish to maintain a level of safety for all children and babies. Some children have life threatening allergies to certain foods so we ask that if you wish to give your child a snack that it be eaten when in the parent's/caregiver's care, following the worship service.

Your child's comfort:

- If your child cries, we will do our best to comfort her/him and give them a little time. If the child continues to be unhappy we will contact you so that you may comfort your child.
- Please note that we do not change diapers or assist in toileting. If your child needs assistance, we will come and get you.



- If at any time your child has an accident we will inform you immediately.
- For your child's safety, we strive to clean the toys on a regular basis.

In case of Emergency: Our caregiver and other Sunday School Volunteers have been trained in emergency procedures. If we need to evacuate the building for any reason we will leave by one of the designated emergency exits. Our designated meeting place is in the Capital Centre parking lot. Please be assured that the caregiver, volunteers and staff at Trinity United Church have been properly informed about our emergency plan.

Thank you for responding to our announcement in early June showing our offerings about \$8,000 below our benchmarks for the end of May. In June we came \$1000 short of our benchmark (a great improvement on \$5,000 for each of April and May) so now we are behind by \$9,000. The benchmarks are only educated guesses as to where we should be each month. The purpose of the benchmark is simply to give us an idea of how we are doing with respect to our budget. If you are behind in your offerings we ask you to work hard to catch up soon. If you have not reviewed your offerings for a year or more please prayerfully consider an increase.

When you visit Swiss Chalet please remember to bring us your table bill. They will generously donate $10\,\%$ of your restaurant expenditures. Offer does not include bar or takeout. This is an arrangement with the North Bay store only.

Bricks and Shingles is up to \$3300 as of June 30 so we are more than halfway to paying for the bricks. The proceeds from the Glitter Dinner were to be divided between the bricks and the Choir gowns - about \$950 each. Your generous donations for the Bricks and Shingles are appreciated. The roof over the narthex needs to be replaced so we will need your support for this too.

Trinity is important to our community through the many and various services it provides. Your support is needed.

Thank you for your donations to Alberta relief. A cheque for \$1856.50 was sent to Toronto for distribution to Alberta.


