From the Minister's Desk:

Singing the Blues this Lent

Everybody has some kind of blues to offer."

~ Iimi Hendrix

he season of Advent, those four Sunday that precede Christmas, are days marked by an attitude of expectation, of waiting and anticipation. The season of Lent has a profoundly different orientation. Lent is not about what is coming, but about what is here. Lent is about "the now." Before we hear the soaring other-worldly good news of Easter, we are faced with the reality of this world—in all its profane, mundane, "what you see is what you get."

It's long struck me that the music of Lent is the blues. Whether or not your favourite song belongs literally to the blues genre, it is the blues which hit us where we live, embodying the highs and lows of human life: sadness and loss; hardship and mortality; brokenness and the search for meaning. The rich

vocabulary of our Christian tradition might speak of lamentation, confession, embodiment, incarnation, and (yes) sin.

Every Sunday this Lent, I've asked members from the wider Trinity community to share with us their blues: a secular song that is nonetheless spiritual: which brings them comfort, makes them think, maybe makes them cry. Along with scripture, prayer, and hymnody, these songs will be a touchstone in each service—deepening in us the awareness of our shared humanity. I hope you'll join us for this experiment in spiritual practice—and that you in turn will feel joined on the lifelong journey of faith.

On Sunday, May 25, the J.O.Y. Band will be musical guests at our worship service. We look forward to this gift of music.

Lent is a time when we contemplate our own mortality

hroughout the Bible, a forty day period plays a significant role in the spiritual journey for our ancestors in Christ. Moses spent 40 days on the mountain of Sinai, Elijah spent 40 days in the cave and for 40 days and nights, the rains came in The Flood. Jesus, after his Baptism, spent 40 days in the desert before he prepared for his public ministry. According to calculations of scholars, Jesus spent 40 hours in the tomb before his resurrection.

In Celtic theology, the number 40 is significant. It represents the concept of "God's will has been completed." Our Lenten journey is 40 days, beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending at Easter. During this time, we listen to difficult Scriptures that confront our very understanding of our lives. For many, Lent is a time of repentance, a time of retreating to the mountain, desert or cave of the soul. One can still be socially engaged with others. but the interior life takes a new shape of simplifying life, getting back to basics and contemplating how to be a better disciple of Jesus Christ.

In the movie Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets there is a char-

acter Moaning Myrtle who is a ghost that haunts the girls lavatory. During the course of the movie, we discover that she died accidentally but remained a ghost because she was still attached to this life and could not understand the circumstance of her own death. One day Harry asks Moaning Myrtle about her whereabouts at a certain time. She says, "I was here, thinking about death." Lent reminds me of Moaning Myrtle's statement: Lent is a time when we contemplate our own mortality in a loving community of fellow companions on a journey. It is a time when we are confronted by our very self and we see our need for Christ in our lives in a new way. Unlike Moaning Myrtle, who is stuck in her own world of death, we know that our period of Lenten journeying will culminate in the hope of Resurrection.

Our culture is increasingly avoiding death yet obsessed with it. Funerals in churches or funeral homes are becoming less popular, wakes even more so. Popular culture is captivated by zombies yet we are simultaneously avoiding funeral practices and talking openly about the reality of death. Christians set aside a sacred time to explore these issues in

Lent, not to avoid our own mortality, but to find meaning in it with and through Christ.

During the Lenten journey, we take austerity measures with our soul, confronting our mortality, our very humanity in a mountain top or desert like journey. Often times, we like to avoid unpleasant issues in life until we are directly confronted by them. Lent is a time when we can take a deep look at ourselves. taking ourselves to the mountain to spend time with God, being adrift on an ark in the rains or putting ourselves in the desert to be confronted by our strengths and weaknesses. It is a time to consider our own death so that we may live in fullness of life.

Our Lenten journey does not need to be solitary. There will be a Lenten Bible study offered every Tuesday in Lent at 1pm in the Fireside Room. We will spend time in spiritual practices based on lectionary readings as they connect to our Lenten Sunday Blues themes. Please join us as we enter into Lent with reverence, curiosity and reflection.




